Character Highlight: This Month is all about the Pillar of RESPECT!

Every month our school highlights and teaches a different pillar of character. The focus for the month of January is RESPECT. Why is respect so important? Respect is the very foundation of a civil society, and it is what we would like to define us as a community. We here at Otis A. Mason Elementary believe that every parent student, teacher, and member of our community should strive to be a respectful member of the community.

- Model and teach your child good manners and discuss them often. Consider good manners at different times of the day: what are good manners at the dining room table? What are good manners in the hallway?
- Allow children to solve problems that arise daily that are age appropriate. Allowing them to solve problems demonstrates your respect for them and helps them to practice respect in their daily lives.
- Follow the Golden Rule and teach children to always treat others the way that they want to be treated. Empathy is so important!
- Avoid bad language and encourage respectful language in various situations. Children will follow your lead.
- Appreciate uniqueness in all the different people you meet and demonstrate the importance of appreciating all the different people in our lives. Talk with your child about the ways people are alike and different and why differences are wonderful. We all share a common humanity and yet we are spectacularly different.
- Teach Layers of Respect by demonstrating to you child how you show respect for: your home, your family, your neighborhood, your school, your community, your city, your state, your country, your values, your world.

A Letter from our RTI/MTSS Team:

Dear OMES Families,

MTSS/RtI meeting invitations are sent via email to the parent/guardian email on file. If your child's teacher has communicated with you that they have referred your child for a possible RtI plan, you can expect to see an initial meeting invitation via email, if student data meets criteria. If your child already has an RtI plan, there are typically review meetings on a six-to-eight-week basis. When you receive an email, there is an option to participate virtually or receive a phone call. If you would like for the school based MTSS/RtI team to phone conference with you, you must reply to the email to request this option. 
A Message from our OMES PTO:
