

We Need You! Volunteer as an Educational Surrogate Parent for a Student with a Disability

There are students with disabilities in our district who very much need an Educational Surrogate Parent. A surrogate parent is an individual who has been appointed to act in the place of a parent in safeguarding a child's rights in the special education decision-making process. The surrogate parent represents the interests of the child in all areas relating to the exceptional student education process and the provision of a free appropriate public education.

A surrogate parent is not someone who takes care of the child (like an adoptive parent or a foster parent) and is not financially responsible for the child. Educational surrogate parents have a very important role. They help the child and the school; they also help their community meet the needs of its students with disabilities. The rewards for surrogate parents: the opportunity to share your time, use your skills, build relationships, and see the results in your own community and in the life of a child.

EDUCATIONAL SURROGATE PARENT TRAINING

Purpose of Training =

- Train volunteers to serve as an Educational Surrogate Parent for a SICSO student with a disability whose parents rights have been terminated or whose parent cannot be focated
- An Educational Surrogate Parent acts in the place of the parent to make educational decisions on behalf of children who are or may be eligible for special education in all matters educing to the identification, evaluation, educational placement, and provision of a free and appropriate public education (FAPE)
- An Educational Surrogate Parent does not take core of the child and is not financially responsible for the child


