Character Highlight: THIS Month is ALL About RESPONSIBILITY:

This month we are focusing on the Character Counts Pillar of Responsibility. **Our district believes that every child has the potential to be responsible** and we need YOUR help! What responsibilities does your child have around the house? Please help us build character in your child by considering the following:

- Emphasize and reward responsible choices but always communicate unconditional love, even when a child makes a poor choice.
- Focus on the process of making good choices and praise and encourage the effort involved in the decision-making process.
- Offer choices with acceptable limits and trust your child to make the decision and learn from mistakes so they can gain confidence.
- Limit screen time and encourage responsible usage by choosing age-appropriate shows, movies, and video games that teach responsibility and ethical decision-making with technology. Consider using video games and screen time as a reward for positive choices.
- Create predictable structure and routine for your child regarding choices and consequences. Does the child know what is expected? Do you allow the child to make the choice? Are the rewards and consequences *known* and *predictable*?

Mrs. Holtz will be visiting your child's classroom soon to discuss the importance of character at our school, in our home, and in our community. We are so proud of our students and the work they do every day to nurture their character. Thank you for helping to make the world a better place, Manatees!

Progress Monitoring with F.A.S.T.

As many of you are aware, we have adopted new state standards called B.E.S.T. standards. Last year, we implemented the English and Language Arts B.E.S.T standards. This year, we have added the new math B.E.S.T Standards and we have begun using a new state testing tool – FAST, which stands for Florida Assessment of Student Thinking. The first of three FAST tests began in early September. There will be a total of three administered during the year: Progress Monitoring/PM1, Progress Monitoring/PM 2, and PM3, which is summative.

By now, many of you have received FAST parent reports. Pre-K through 2nd-grade students' parents' received copies of the report. Parents of 3rd through 5th grade students will access the report via Home Access Center (HAC). If your child scored a level 1 or 2 on the FAST, <u>do not panic</u> but make sure you attend your Parent/Teacher Conference (10/10-10/31). The test assesses students on end-of-year expectations. It is expected that students would not be scoring high on the assessment as we are teaching the standards during the school year. However, it helps the teacher, and the parent, pinpoint areas to focus on. The parentteacher conference is the best tool for the next step for student success.
