Character Highlight: This Month is all about the Pillar of CARING!

Every month our school highlights and teaches a different pillar of character. The focus for the month of February is CARING. Why is it so important to be caring in our community? - EXPRESS GRATITUDE. Does your child show gratitude to you? What about siblings? Are they able to say "thank you" regularly to those who provide services: waiters, bus drivers, teachers, cashiers, and clerks?
- HELP THOSE IN NEED. It is never too early to get your child involved in charitable giving. Teach them to recognize when someone is struggling and what age-appropriate help looks like. Include your child in making donations to charitable organizations when clothing or toys are outgrown.
- ACTS OF KINDNESS: Consider incorporating random acts of kindness into your household and neighborhood. Check out the amazing and positive acts of kindness that have gone viral online!
- ONLINE CARING-What does it look like? If social media is a large part of your family life, be sure to demonstrate kind online etiquette to set a good example for your child. Talk through specific examples and coach compassion in your child. Online content and access should always be age appropriate

OMES Community Service Project: Join us for the Kids Heart Challenge!



Dear Manatee Families,

It's that time of year again for Manatee Students to participate in the Kids Heart Challenge - Jump Rope for Heart (JR4H), our annual community service project to raise funds for the American Heart Association! This year marks the 19th consecutive year that Mason Elementary has participated. Last year, Otis A. Mason Elementary School was the Top Fundraiser in St. Johns County, raising \$31,838, and one of the top schools in the state. Amazing! During the past 18 years, Manatees have raised nearly \$200,000 to fund research, necessary equipment for patients, and educational materials to help students learn about how the body works and how to care for personal wellness.

Over the next few weeks, your children will learn about their Heart-Health, practice their Jump-Rope Skills, as well as various "Jump Stations" to practice balance and timing, and will have the **opportunity** to give back to the Northeast Florida Community while helping earn PE equipment for our school. "A Win Win!!!"

The 2023 Kids Heart Challenge - Jump Rope for Heart Fundraising Campaign will run from Wednesday, February 8 – Tuesday, February 21, 2023. During the dates of February 9 – February 17, we will conduct our Kids Heart Challenge - Jump Rope for Heart Class Events during regularly scheduled P.E. 1 classes. All students will get to participate in fun activities and the Jump Rope for Heart Celebration. Students may wear an Honor Heart to jump "In Honor" of someone they know who has been affected by heart disease. Please send in Gummy Fruit Snacks for a station rotation for your child's class event.

Our goal this year is to raise \$32,000. Wow, a huge goal, but I know that when Manatees get behind a challenge, anything is possible. The donation envelope your child is bringing home on February 8th is an invitation for your family to discuss the impact of heart disease. "A Day Without Violence" District-Wide Art Contest

Do you have a student/child excelling in art?

If so, St. John County is holding an "A DAY WITHOUT VIOLENCE" Calendar Art & Poetry Contest. Poems and artwork should reflect life in a world without violence. Judges will look for art and poems that make a positive statement about a world without violence.

Images of diverse kinds of people, places and things that portray a harmonious way of life, a respectful living and working environment as well as children interacting with not only each other, but also animals. Even their favorite cartoon character or images of peaceful and fun activities that can be done alone or in groups are also encouraged. Any drawings or poems depicting firearms, knives or any other violent images will NOT be eligible; violent images with a ban sign through them will not be eligible.

The purpose of these activities is to interrupt what otherwise may become a generational cycle of domestic violence. The entry may only be 8 ½ by 11-size paper with NO computer graphic images, horizontal, and all art must be hand drawn. Drawings on poetry entries will not be eligible, only the poems. Only one entry per student- either poetry or art will be accepted.

Each student MUST have an entry form attached to the back of his or her work with clear tape. Please help ensure that the names and information are written clearly.

If your student is interested, please have them see me (Mrs. C) for an entry form.

Deadline Due to me (Mrs. C) no later than April 25th. NO EXCEPTIONS after the 25th.
