What should 2nd grade parents know?

MANNERS MATTER. When you are at Otis A. Mason, your character counts. We all learn best when we feel respected.

It's okay not to know, but it's NOT okay to refuse to try. The effort you put in each day will pay off as you find yourself reaching your goals. *Every* assignment, *every* activity matters.

We are growing readers. Our goal is to independently read and comprehend grade-level text. Practice at home!

What can we do with our 2nd grader at home?

There's a method to mathematics! The curriculum develops your child's understanding of place value and number sense. Let them teach YOU new strategies!

Read, read, read! Reading should be done for enjoyment. All readers benefit from having someone read to them or by reading to someone else. Share the joy of reading.

2nd grade is a bridge to more independent learning. Allow your child opportunities to be independent at home.

Every month our school highlights and teaches a different pillar of character. The focus for the month of February is CARING. *Why is it so important to be caring in our community?* Caring is the very foundation of a civil society, and it is what we would like to define us as a community. We here at Otis A. Mason Elementary believe that every parent, student, teacher, and member of our community should **strive to be a CARING member of the community.**

- **BE KIND!** Show your child what kindness looks like in all situations (*especially* when you are in situations where you are angry, frustrated, disappointed, and tired).
- EXPRESS GRATITUDE. Does your child show gratitude to you? What about siblings? Are they able to say "thank you" regularly to those who provide services: waiters, bus drivers, teachers, cashiers, and clerks?
- HELP THOSE IN NEED. It is never too early to get your child involved in charitable giving. Teach them to recognize when someone is struggling and how to help in an age-appropriate way. Include your child in making donations to charitable organizations when clothing or toys are outgrown.
- ACTS OF KINDNESS: Consider incorporating random acts of kindness into your household and neighborhood. Check out the amazing and positive acts of kindness that have gone viral online!
- ONLINE CARING-What does it look like? If social media is a large part of your family life, be sure to demonstrate kind online etiquette to set a good example for your child. Talk through specific examples and coach compassion in your child. Online content and access should always be age appropriate.


