Manatee Highlight: Our Pre-K Team



Our pre-k team is the most hard-working and dedicated team around. We just had to highlight the delightful shenanigans of Mr. Ross' classroom, the glittery goodness of Mrs. Burchfield's team, and the welcoming aura of Mrs. Piercy's lessons. These classroom teachers are assisted by the most loving paraprofessionals, Mrs. Hale, Mrs. Bailey, Mrs. Canada, and Mrs. Bogert. In addition, we have two ASL interpreters, Mr. Randolph and Mr. Solis. This incredible, superhero team brings the joy of learning to their students every day! Our pre-k team wanted to send these tips:

Three things to know about the Pre-k classroom.

- 1. Pre-K is a mixed aged and ability classroom with students from ages 3-5 at all ability levels from learning to speak and learning to read.
- 2. The teaching team has experience in general education and special needs classrooms from PK-12thgrades.
- 3. We have 60 grade level standards we continuously monitor and assess throughout the year.

What can I practice at home with my child?

- 1. <u>Social Skills</u> That turn taking includes *asking* for a turn and *waiting* for a turn.
- 2. <u>Independence with clothing</u> zipping, buttoning, lacing, pulling shirts and pants on and off.
- 3. <u>Food Exploration</u> The district has a set menu of pre-k meals to limit choking hazards, there are no choices work on trying new foods at home.

What resources do you recommend?

- 1. Try a non-stimulating app that encourages critical thinking like PokPok play room
- 2. The SJCPLS has story times weekly with interactive crafts that focus on school readiness skills. They have various sensory, fine motor & dramatic play toys.
- 3. Try an indoor playroom or gym for students with different abilities/needs like Sensory Towne or Rock the Spectrum Gym.

Character Highlight: This Month is all about the Pillar of TRUSTWORTHINESS!

Why is it so important to be trustworthy in our community? Trustworthiness is the very foundation of a civil society, and it is what we would like to define us as a community. We here at Otis A. Mason Elementary believe that every parent, student, teacher, and member of our community should **strive to be a TRUSTWORTHY member of the community.**

- Be honest. There are so many ambiguous situations that your child needs guidance on in daily life. Guide them with honesty and help walk your child through the right, honest choice and explain why the honest approach is the best one.
- Be reliable. It is so important to do what you say you will do. Whether making a promise or issuing a consequence, exemplify to your child what it means to be dependable.
- Do the right thing even when no one is watching. Be a brave superhero and applaud your child for making good choices (especially when they did it on their own!).
- Teach your child the importance of a good reputation.
 Being a trustworthy person with a good reputation opens innumerable doors of opportunity. Act as if every action is publicized on the front page of the newspaper or broadcast on YouTube.
- **Dive into examples and scenarios:** Does omitting the truth count as a lie? Does it count as stealing if the item is lost? What about inexpensive? What is the right thing to do if your child finds a wallet? Cash on the ground?



Returning Student Verification is Coming to your Email Inbox Soon

Every year around April, the SJCSD will email a returning student verification. This is a link to update and reenroll your child in school. The form saves the data from the last time you completed it so updating is easy. BE CAREFUL!

The RSV does not contain any changes made through the Front Office throughout the school year. For example, if you have added/subtracted emergency contacts over the school year, these will not be represented. PLEASE review the information carefully. The district does not send the link for all students at the same time so do not panic if you receive one child's and not another's. Each grade is sent separately and first to one parent, and then to another.


