Character Highlight: How can I instill good character in my child?

We will be reviewing **ALL of the pillars of character** in your child's classroom. We here at Otis A. Mason Elementary believe that every member of our community should **strive to have good character.**

• Citizenship

Is your child old enough to learn how to care for your American flag or a community space? Are they ready to explore age-appropriate news and community events? Could your family participate in a community cleanup?

• Responsibility

Post a chore list on the fridge and give your child the power to complete those chores as a responsible member of the family. Consider a family game night as a reward!

• Fairness

Help your child create fair rules for play and for the household. What is a fair way to share family decision making? Who will pick the restaurant this time? Who decides which book the family will read together?

Caring

Show gratitude at the dinner table. Take turns sharing what you are grateful for.

• Trustworthiness

Show your child good examples of honesty. Highlight courageous acts of truth, especially when someone made a mistake. It is truly brave to atone for a mistake.

Respect

Discuss what is respectful in various settings: the movie theater, the car, the classroom, the park. What is respectful when dealing with different people: a friend, a teacher, a waiter, a grandparent, a public servant?

Returning Student Verification (RSV)

This month the St. John's County School District will email guardians regarding returning students. Please make sure the email we have on file for you is correct in our eSchool system. Please take your time and thoroughly read through your RSV. The system does save your input from the last time you filled it out (but it will not include changes that you made throughout the school year). Make sure the information included, emergency contacts listed, and medical information input is the most up-to-date. Due to the volume of students, the RSV is emailed in stages by grade. Please do not worry if you see an RSV for one student, but not another, it is coming-please, be patient. Once we have attempted to reach the primary guardian listed in eSchool, the RSV will automatically be emailed to the secondary guardian on file. The emails will be repeated until one guardian has successfully submitted the RSV. Guidance Corner: Calming Strategies for Your Child



to Teach Deep Breathing

What is STAR Breathing? – It promotes relaxation and selfregulation. Deep breathing helps to bring more oxygen into the bloodstream. It has a physical effect on the body and helps the individual to calm down. STAR breathing is an easy exercise to practice at home and school.

Have your child trace a star graphic (like the one above) with their finger while breathing in through their nose and out through their mouth. Encourage them by modeling it with them and breathing slowly and deeply.
