- Teach responsibility with belongings.
- Coach your child through feelings, conflicts, sharing, and proper conflict resolution.
- Include your child in...well...everything! Engaging your child in the world around them is a wonderful way to learn!

### **Character Highlight: The Pillar of RESPECT!**

The character focus for the month of January is RESPECT. Why is respect so important? Respect is the very foundation of a civil society, and it is what we would like to define us as a community. We here at Otis A. Mason Elementary believe that every parent student, teacher, and member of our community should strive to be a respectful member of the community.

- How can we make teaching manners fun? Model and teach your child good manners with a Fancy Tea Party Night or by hosting a dinner with friends and family. Use real-life examples as teachable moments.
- Respect your child by letting them problem solve their **issues first.** When appropriate, allow your child to solve their own problems first. Students really appreciate the opportunity!
- Some things never change: Follow the Golden Rule! Empathy is so important! Coach your child to imagine how their words and actions affect others.
- **Show respect with your language:** Children will follow your lead so let them hear positive, respectful language especially in times of conflict.
- Highlight and respect differences in our world. Show your child the glorious tapestry all different cultures create when we come together as one world! All people share a common humanity and yet we are spectacularly different. Let's celebrate it!
- **How does respect look...?** ...in the car? ...in the home? ...in the hallway? ...in school? ... with family? ... with people we don't know? ...in a restaurant? Always have a discussion with your child about how to show respect, even when it may be challenging.



#### Celebrate Literacy Week: read with us!



Celebrate Literacy Week, Florida! January 27-31, 2025



Celebrate Literacy Week, Florida! is designed to raise awareness about the importance of reading and to inspire Florida's students and families to make reading part of their daily routines.

This week our goal is to inspire a love for reading and enhance vocabulary skills among our students.

Just like builders use tools to create amazing structures, our students will use books to build their knowledge and vocabulary! For many of us, our love for reading started with one book or one author. On Tuesday, January 28th we invite our students to dress-up as a storybook character from one of their favorite books to share their love for reading.

This week we will also celebrate our 100th day of school on Thursday, January 30th! We have constructed a strong learning foundation during these first 100 days. Please see communication from your child's classroom teacher to see how this day will be celebrated.

Throughout the week, we will be tracking:

- Books Read: Our Prekindergarten through Second Grade students will be creating a visual representation to show how each book we read contributes to our literacy foundation.
- Vocabulary Acquired: New vocabulary words learned during the week will be displayed to symbolize the continued construction of our vocabulary knowledge.
  - Words Read: The total number of words read by each class will be displayed to show how we continually build and support our literacy

We encourage you to support your child by discussing the books they are reading and the new words they are learning. Together, we can construct a strong foundation for their future success.

#### Literacy Week Shoebox Art Contest: Bring Your Favorite Book to Life!

Family Ideas for Celebrate Literacy Week:

Pick a more advanced book to read aloud as a family and discuss in the living room instead of watching TV. Check out audio books for the car too! Try **D.E.A.R.** (Drop Everything And Read) times for your household to wear PJs and snuggle with a good book. Compare and contrast different books as a family around the dinner table.

#### Take the Reader's Oath Together:

I promise to read each day and each night. I know it's the key to growing up right. I'll read to myself, I'll read to a crowd. It makes no difference if silent or loud. I'll read at my desk, at home and at school, on my bean bag or bed, by the fire or pool. Each book that I read puts smarts in my head, 'cause brains grow more thoughts the more they are fed. So I take this oath to make reading my way of feeding my brain what it needs every day.

#### Get Inspired: The 7 Habits of Happy Kids

We highly suggest the books *The Seven Habits of Happy Kids* by Sean Curtis. As well as the companion book for adults The Seven Habits of Highly Effective People by the same author.

- Be Proactive. Kids often complain about boredom and blame their feelings on others. Guide your child to take charge of their feelings. Boredom is an easy "problem" to fix!
- Begin with the end in mind. What is a goal that your child has? Help them to practice making plans to achieve that goal!
- **Put first things first.** "Work first, then play." Does your child know what values you prioritize? How can we demonstrate balance in life that prioritizes what is MOST important?
- **Think "win-win**." Everyone can win. If we always think about how what we do and what we want affects others. Teach your child to make decisions by considering others as well.
- Seek First to Understand, Then to be **Understood:** Listen before you talk. Be sure to demonstrate this with your child too!
- **Synergize.** Teach your child that together is always better!
- **Sharpen the Saw.** A balanced life helps with everything. Be sure that kids get the proper food, sleep, and exercise for example!
