#### Fun Ways to Help Your 1st Grader at Home!

- 1. **Read Together Every Day** Snuggle up and read a book with your child. Talk about the story and ask fun questions like "What do you think will happen next?"
- 2. Play with Words Practice sight words and letter sounds with flashcards or games. Make it silly and exciting!
- 3. **Count Everything!** Count toys, snacks, or steps together. Try simple adding and subtracting with things you have around the house.
- 4. **Explore Outside** Go on a nature walk! Look at flowers, bugs, and trees. Chat about what you see and listen to your child's questions.
- 5. **Write Stories** Encourage your child to write about their day or their favorite things. Drawing pictures and writing go hand-in-hand!
- 6. **Measure and Compare** Use a ruler, measuring cups, or even paper clips to measure toys or ingredients. Compare which is bigger, heavier, or longer.
- 7. **Ask and Wonder** Ask your child why they think something happens or what might happen next. It's a great way to spark their imagination!
- 8. **Practice Responsibility** Give your child simple jobs at home (set the table, feed the pet, pack your snack for school) to build independence.
- 9. **Take Turns** Play board games or card or card games as a family! It teaches patience and fairness.

### **Character Highlight: Manatees are RESPONSIBLE!**





















Why is "RESPONSIBILITY" so important? Good character is the very foundation of a civil society, and it is what we would like to define us as a community. We here at Otis A. Mason Elementary believe that every parent, student, teacher, and member of our community should strive to be responsible. How can we do that TOGETHER?

- <u>Introduction:</u> How can we teach our child to be responsible for themselves and their actions? Perhaps we can guide them to not only be responsible for what they do, but also to take responsibility for causes they find to be important in our world. How can everyone contribute to improving the world around them?
- <u>Give clear, specific responsibilities to your child:</u> Give your child appropriate responsibilities and guide them in managing those responsibilities. These should be age-appropriate tasks and chores. Make sure that your child sees their contribution to family responsibilities and the household. Show your child that everyone has an important role and responsibility in the home including them!
- <u>Teach your child that caring and trying MATTERS:</u> We can't always get it right the first time and sometimes it is difficult to fulfill our responsibilities. It is okay to struggle & to ask for help sometimes! We can't fix most problems overnight, but taking the first step is important. If every person in the world picked up one piece of litter, there wouldn't be any!
- Responsibility at School: Have your child pack their backpack, make their lunch, or create school routines as their age allows. Teach them the importance of punctuality and cleaning up after themselves. Have them label their belongings and check Lost and Found regularly. Taking ownership of these tasks is crucial!


## FREE Health Screenings 10/7


