-Communication skills (writing, speaking, listening) study skills, time management, goal setting

Partnerships

-Site, district, home, community



A Typical Day in an AVID Elementary Classroom

- Students use agenda/planner throughout the day
- Organizational tools are expected to be used throughout the day
- Note-taking strategies are utilized by all students
- Lessons with an emphasis on WICOR are represented in a variety of subjects

teach"


